President's Message

I would like to share with the members of SCGS some extraordinarily good news that we received within the last few weeks. Many members who have been with the Society for a long time know that we were the beneficiaries of a Charitable Remainder Trust from Medford Stone which was administered by Philo Van Waggoner. Mr. Van Waggoner passed away several weeks ago. Since that time we have been working with the trustee to take possession of the bequest.

The Society's Building Fund is the beneficiary of two trusts -- thus restricting use of the assets. The liquidation of the combined assets, depending on market conditions, will net the Society around \$980,000. That cash will be held in a separate investment account pending decisions on further investment. While this creates a better vision for our future home, it still leaves us with precarious funding for our day-to-day operations.

The timing of this boon could not be better. The Long Range Planning Committee is investigating a possible location for a future home for SCGS with the City of Glendale as it builds a new library facility. Discussions are still preliminary and we are nowhere near a decision on whether this new facility will be a possibility for our future. We will keep you informed as we go forward.

Now that we have secured a financial position that may allow us to find a permanent home, we will have to concentrate on securing the future of our operating expenses with a similar set of investments in an endowment account.

I believe that these items are great news for the Society and Library. I want to thank Jay Holladay, Jan Jennings, Doug Miller, Lin LaRochelle, and Betty Jones for being so diligent in tracking this over the years. In addition, I want to express my appreciation to all of our past and present Long Range Planning Committees and Boards of Directors for positioning us to address the future.

Thanks to all in the Society that have made these things possible.

And, speaking of new, I just want to mention again that Ancestry.com has the complete Drouin microfilm of the parish records on line and they are in the process of creating an index for them. What a great research tool this is. You can obtain copies of your earliest ancestors' baptism, marriage and burial records, as they were written in the parish registers.

We were the recipient of a \$1,000 grant from the Quebec Government. The \$1,000 must be used to add to our Quebec collection. If any of you know of any Quebec research resources available for purchase that would enhance our collection, please let me know.

As you know, we sponsor the French Heritage DNA Project, www.frenchdna.org. The membership of this group is approaching 900 and might surpass 1,000 by the end of the year. It's a Small, Small World

In one of last year's Jamboree feedback surveys, someone suggested that we think about holding "Birds of a Feather" sessions for the 2008 Jamboree.

I didn't know what that was, but it piqued my curiosity. We're always looking for new ideas to make Jamboree even better. So I Googled and found this description on WordSpy.com: "birds of a feather meeting. A meeting held at a computer-related trade show or conference in which people who work in the same technology area at different companies exchange information and experiences. (Often abbreviated as "BOF meeting.")"

We thought it was a great idea and adapted it for genealogy. With apologies for the earworms* that this is bound to cause, our session is called "It's a Small, Small World."

Saturday from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. we will set up informal round-table areas that will be organized by ethnicity. Each round table will be hosted by someone experienced in researching that particular area or ethnicity.

Table hosts don't need to be experts in the research. They just need to be friendly and willing to welcome people to the table and keep the conversation going. So far, we have the following ethnic specialties on board: African-American, German, Irish, Jewish, Polish, Portuguese, Scottish and Swedish.

We are still working on lining up other ethnic table hosts. If you would like to host a table, please drop us a line and let us know your specialty. We'll keep posting updates to this list over the next weeks.

Bring your experience and draw from the learning experiences of others who are researching in your area. Share the best websites, tell about records that have been most valuable, bring examples.
