The Essential Guide to Tracing Your Family History*, is much more than a companion to the NBC series first season.

The book's focus is on resources and tips for both the newbie genealogist, as well as the experienced hand. The first chapter helps the newbie get started on their Ancestor Hunt. Especially important throughout the book are cautions about tactics that led many of us down the wrong trails or prevented us from looking at the right ones. Questions are answered such as is there only one correct way to spell our surname? (No!) Graphics help explain unfamiliar concepts. Many websites are noted, but the limitations of using only websites also are shown. Readers will want to peruse the case studies to get new ideas. It's an easy read and hard to put down.

The center 24 pages have photos and synopses of the stories of those who appeared on this landmark television show last season -- Matthew Broderick, Lisa Kudrow, Spike Lee, Sarah Jessica Parker, Susan Sarandon, Brooke Shields, and Emmitt Smith. Have you been looking for a project to keep you busy while you're inside, avoiding those hot summer days? We have just the answer.

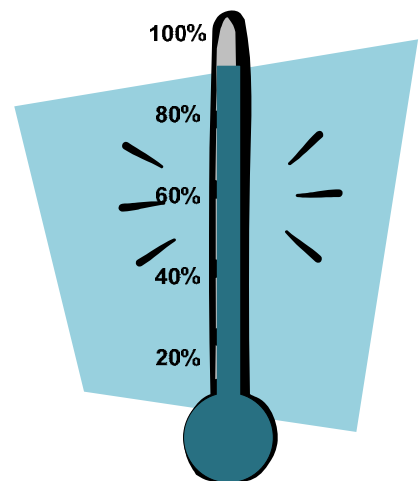
SCGS is collaborating with The World Archives Project and several other California genealogical societies to transcribe the California Naturalization Record Original Documents (1795 - 1972). Because the other societies have been working on this file for a while, over 85% of the documents have already been transcribed.

SCGS 11TH ANNUAL GENEii WRITERS CONTEST IS NOW OPEN



The 2010 GENEii Family History Writers Contest is dedicated to the memory of Elizabeth "Beth" Maltbie Uyehara, who founded the contest in 2000. Beth passed away on March 6, 2010.



Guidelines:

- Entries must be received between November 1 and December 31, 2010.
- Writers may submit multiple entries in either and/or both categories.
- Each entry must be submitted in online, via email, sent to

SCGS-Writing-Contest@scgsgenealogy.com

- The cover letter should be included in the body of the email. It should include the author's name, address, telephone number, and e-mail address; the title of the article; the word count; and the category entered (1 or 2).
- Endnotes need not be included in the word count. Entries may be either single or double spaced, and subjects need not relate to California or the United States.
- Winners will be notified individually by May 1, 2011, and a listing of winning entries will be posted on the SCGS website at that same time. The winners' names will also be printed in the summer issue of *The Searcher*, the quarterly journal of SCGS.
- The judges will use four criteria in evaluating the entries: 1) overall interest and impact, 2) accuracy and carefulness with facts, 3) "voice" and language, and 4) writing mechanics (clarity, grammar).
- Certificates will be issued for first, second, and third place, honorable mention, and finalist at the discretion of the judges. All decisions are final. All research used in the articles must be supported by endnote citations. For guidelines on citation style, see *Evidence, Citation & Analysis for the Family Historian*, by Elizabeth Shown Mills (Genealogical Publishing Company), or *The Chicago Manual of Style*, by University of Chicago Press Staff.
- Entrants grant SCGS the one-time right to publish their articles in the SCGS journal *The Searcher*; and/or the SCGS website; and/or to publish their article in an anthology of winning entries. Previously published articles should include permission to reprint from the prior publisher.

In both its printed and electronic forms, the newsletter served the membership well. We will all remember it fondly as we go on to more modern methods of communication.

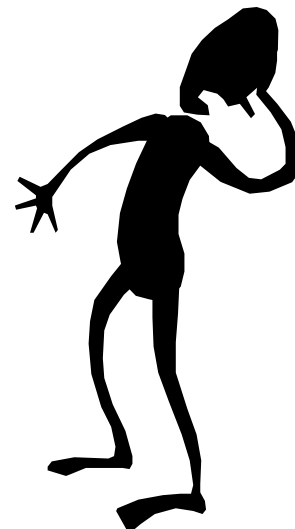

Le Programme de Recherche en Démographie Historique (PRDH)

By the time you read this, the online PRDH should already be accessible on all Patron computers at the library.

For those not familiar with the PRDH, the database is a reconstruction of the population of Québec from the beginnings of French colonization in the 17th century through the late 18th century. Online data are based on parish records and include the full names of almost everyone who was listed on a baptismal, marriage, or burial certificate (including witnesses and spouses). For every individual mentioned, the PRDH includes their sex, age, marital status, whether living or deceased, occupation, kinship, and places of residence and origin if that information was available.

LDS "France" films

The **FCHSC** has a project underway to house in our collection at the SCGS library (a designated FamilySearch Center) as many LDS "France" films as possible. The cost to keep a film on "indefinite loan" is \$18.00 per film. If you would like the **FCHSC** to order a film or films for you, please go to the Family History Library catalog (www.familysearch.org) and obtain the **Film Number** and **Title of Record** for each of your selected film(s).
