

Learn to trace your family tree

Southern California Genealogical Society will present its bicentennial project in tracing the family tree through the various eras in American History at its sixth Annual Genealogical Jamboree to be held Saturday, May 3 from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Rodger Young Center, 936 W. Washington Bl., Donation is \$1. The public is invited.

The Jamboree features such exhibits as the Beginner's Corner for those new to family research, as well as information on how to utilize old maps and local county records.

How to preserve family photographs, compile and publish family charts and genealogies is part of the material explained. Examples of local records, histories, vital statistics, and censuses will be offered by displays from regional sections, such as New England, the South, Mid-Atlantic States, as well as foreign countries.

Representatives with research materials will be available from a number of patriotic societies including the Daughters of the American Revolution, Sons of the Revolution, United Daughters of the Confederacy, and others. There will also be an expert on heraldry and family coats of arms there with displays. All displays are manned by experienced researchers so you can ask questions.

The Jamboree is designed for both the amateur and the experienced researcher to meet and share knowledge. In addition to the annual Jamboree, the society holds informative meetings on the subject of genealogy open at
